

Is a vigil light burning 24/7 and kept near the Blessed Sacrament. The light indicates the unfathomable mystery of the Eucharistic presence of Jesus. It reminds us of the reverence due to the Sacrament. The burning light is a pious custom as a way of prolonging our adoration and prayer to honor His presence.

### For the upcoming Liturgical commemorations for Holy Week:

**Palm Sunday**: No Processions. Blessed Palms will be distributed in the Church for those who want or in the future for those who are staying home. Palms will be kept as fresh as possible at the parish office for several weeks. (11:00 AM)

**Monday & Tuesday:** The Arrival at the Harbor. (6:30 PM)

**Holy Wednesday**: The Rite of the Lamp is always for the sick, and this year the Liturgy takes on a new, more poignant meaning. Holy Oil from the Rite of the Lamp will be placed in individual containers and made available at the parish office for several weeks. (6:30 PM)

**Holy Thursday**: No Washing of the Feet. (6:30 PM)

**Good Friday**: Signing of the Chalice. (10:00 AM)

**Good Friday**: No Processions, No kissing of the Cross for Burial of the Lord. (6:30 PM)

Holy Saturday: Rite of Forgiveness will be celebrated as usual. (11:00 AM)

Easter Sunday: No Processions. (11:00 AM)
