Dear Parishioners,

Since the restrictions on gathering into phase II are eased, we are relieved to be able to assemble to worship in a larger group. I would like to have no more than 50 people in the church on each of the 5:00 PM Saturday Liturgy and the 11:00 AM Sunday Liturgy.

However, we have to be vigilant and prudent to the ongoing risk, and in an attempt to protect each other, to remain strong and decrease the risk to any parishioner getting sick with COVID19, I would like to recommend the following:

1- Parishioners are advised to avoid coming to church if having elevated temperature, or if any family member have any encounter with a person who have Flu like symptoms or one family member or more have these symptoms themselves; such as runny nose, cough, sore throat, fever, shortness of breath, body ache, loss of sense of smell or taste etc...

2- We have hand sanitizer, but please bring your own, if available, to keep all hands clean periodically.

3- Avoid touching and hand shaking during this stage.

4- Let us protect each other by trying to wear face mask

5- Let us practice social distancing by keeping at least 6 feet between each other. A group of one family may sit next to each other if they live in the same house.

Please let me know if you are coming to either Saturday or Sunday's liturgy, and how many. Once we reach the number 50, the rest may stay in the parking lot, share the Liturgy with us on Facebook and can receive the Eucharist at the end of the Liturgy.
