Announcement to the Virgin Mary

Qurbono P. 27; Creed P. 748; Anaphora of St. James p. 794

Mary, a young Jewish girl, was hand-picked by God to be the mother of his only-begotten Anointed Son. Having chosen a life of solitude and set out to serve the Temple, God interfered in her life and changed her plan. When the Angel Gabriel announced to her the conception through the Holy Spirit, she was troubled and she wondered as to how such a thing might happen when she knows no man and when she intended to live her life for God alone. God's messenger Gabriel explained to her that this is God's plan, and no man will father her child. It is the will of God that she might accept; and it is God's power that changes and does the impossible.

A non-married Jewish female, found with a child in her father's home, Mary realized the embarrassment, the scandal, and the tremendous disappointment, let alone the shame she would inflict upon her highly regarded family in the community. The unquestioned obedience of Mary and her heroic decision are awesome. So young she was to decipher the signs and to be involved in God's plan. How wise was she to be able to see through this whole ordeal. In spite of the great risk and danger which surrounded her, in spite of the fact that many people will stigmatize her, in spite of the fact that she is running the risk of being stoned to death, she disregarded what humanity thinks and chose what God wants. What a powerful lesson God gives us through the life of Mary, the Mother of God.

It did not take Mary too long to comprehend God's Divine Plan and to learn that God's son is the long awaited hope of the prophets. Unlike Zechariah who wanted a sign from God's messenger that whatever was promised was to happen, Mary did not test the ability of the creator but thoroughly succumbed to his will and fully accepted the announcement with unquestioned obedience. The Angel's sign to Zechariah was to strike him mute until the birth of his newly promised son John is born, whereas the Angel's sign to Mary was the bearing of good news. Gabriel announced to Mary that her kinswoman Elizabeth is no longer barren, but is now expecting a son in her old age. Mary believed the Angel's good news and she was happy for her cousin's blessing. This sign was enough for Mary to realize that this Angel's business is *real* and it is coming from God. In all humility and total obedience, Mary's response came: "I am the servant of the Lord, let it be done to me as you say." Through her obedience, Mary transformed the face of the world as the Lord worked through her. Cooperating with God, doing his will and obeying His statutes is a guarantee for us to earn Eternal Life. The Scriptures are full of stories and parables showing the destiny of the people who disobeyed God and the rewards of those who cooperated with him and obeyed His commands. God will work miracles through us if we obey Him and His Church.
