# **Third Sunday after Holy Cross**

## Qurbono P. 606; Creed P. 748; Anaphora of The Twelve Apostles p. 754

## (Matthew 24:23-31)

This Sunday's Gospel is the continuation of the theme of last Sunday. It announces the signs of the coming of our Lord, narrated by St. Matthew in the final sermon of Jesus about the last things, before his passion, death, resurrection, second coming and his eternal presence in the Church. Jesus will establish his new kingdom on the ruins of this passing earthly kingdom! This is our true Christian faith concerning the Second Coming of the Lord.

Jesus warns his disciples about those who try to mislead the people of God. He emphasizes that his coming will not happen in an obscure way, but rather, it would be as clear as the lightning that flashes in the skies whereby it would be impossible for the naked eye to miss it. His coming would be as visible as the carcass to the vultures! The last paragraph has a prophetic description and talks about Jesus' coming into the world in a wondrous fashion, which is not detailed historically and realistically. This is an expression about the importance of God's plan of salvation, as if he is turning this universe to nothing, in order to recreate it as a newer and a better world!

As for the sign of the Son of Man, the Fathers of the Church saw in it the CROSS. Better yet, they saw in it Christ himself who was crucified, who truly died, and who rose from the dead in triumph and went into his glory! The last and final look at the complete salvific plan is not common among the Jewish thoughts that were contemporary to Jesus, such as the community of Qumran, which limits salvation only to one specific group of the people of God.

Jesus was concerned about two dangers threatening the church: (a) False leaders and (b) discouragement:

- (a) There would be the danger of those leaders who would spread false teaching propagating their own version of the truth rather than presenting and witnessing to the truth that was taught by Jesus. These false leaders were looking for fame, personal gain, and notoriety, making people believe in them rather than in Jesus Christ. The teaching of such false leaders is bent on individualistic attitude and self-glorification which would inevitably bring about confusion an division among people.
- (b) There would be the danger of discouragement as a result of chaos and lawlessness. Because of such situation many people will be discouraged and their love for God will grow cold. A true Christian is known by believing in God and in his Son Jesus Christ no matter what the circumstances are. Anything less would be an insult to God for not trusting enough in him to save us.

The great consolation for us is that Christ's coming at the end of time assures us of two great facts: (a) is the ultimate triumph of Christ. He who was the mockery of men and was crucified and died, will one day be the Lord of all. The king of kings, the supreme judge and the ruler of the universe, sitting at the right hand of God the Father. (b) History is not ending with the final battle between good and evil. Many believe that history is headed toward a global and unending chaos. Many so-called prophets would speculate about how the world might end, selling their own version, which may be misleading. According to the gospel, the Second Coming of Christ will be the greatest event of all of history, toward which the entire universe is heading. It is not to destroy us but it is the eternal and final rule of God who will send his angels in order to gather his chosen ones from the four corners of the universe and to protect them. This is a consolation to those who believe. The choice is ours to be or not to be saved, and that is to believe in his gospel.
